Leading the way is The Buckingham Clinic in Glasgow who, with two Accu SPINA IDD Therapy machines, have been providing IDD Therapy the longest.

Sheffield Physiotherapy's John Wood talks IDD Therapy at spring Spinal Symposium

At a conference in Basingstoke organised by leading spinal surgeon Andrew Quaile (left), experienced

physiotherapist John Wood (right) was invited to talk about the place of IDD Therapy disc treatment in modern conservative spinal care - "Dressed up traction or a new opportunity for back pain sufferers".



John has been using IDD Therapy at his busy Sheffield Physiotherapy Clinic for several years. "Traction as a modality for back pain treatment went out of vogue." he says. "One of the main issues with traditional traction was the inability to treat isolated spinal segments.

IDD Therapy gives physios a tool which enables us to take pressure off targeted discs whilst helping to restore motion in the spine."



Other topics at the conference attended by 140 clinicians from across Hampshire included a review of Modic Antibiotic Spinal Therapy (MAST), the use of Platelet Rich Plasma in discs and a look at patient management strategies.

Could you lift this for 25 minutes?!



It takes a 'distraction' or pulling force of half a patient's body weight (applied measured comfortably at angles) to open a lumbar spinal segment.

If someone weighs 10 stone, that equates to 63.6kgs. Divide that by two for half

body weight and you can see that you need a force of over 30kgs to open the joint!

The IDD Therapy 'Spina' machines give clinicians a tool which enables them to apply such forces safely and comfortably at precise angles for 25 minutes.

Spinex Disc Clinic opens second location in the heart of rugby country

The **Spinex Disc Clinic** was the first UK clinic to use the name "Disc" in its title, reflecting the clinic's mission to help people in serious pain caused by disc-related issues.

Having benefited from IDD Therapy treatment for her own disc problem, clinic director Sally Lansdale opened the first Spinex Disc Clinic in London's Edgware Road and within a year has opened a second clinic in Twickenham.
